As many of you know, I have just returned from a visit with my dad. It has been a year since my mom passed away. My brother, sister and I planned "tag team" trips to be with Dad to help him get through the one-year anniversary of our shared loss.

I kept expecting Mom to come out of the kitchen to ask if we wanted something to snack on, or to hear her laughter float through the house. Living far enough away not to be able to go home often, I realized that, in some ways, her permanent absence remains unreal to me.

Early in the visit I became aware of my own ultra sensitivity to being home and trying to take in any and all sensations that I was presented with: the smell of the air, the song birds, the wind in the trees, etc. While visiting with Mom's sisters, I found myself listening closer and looking deeper into the eyes of their wrinkled faces, in search of a glimpse of my mother. Later in the week I was present at a family reunion on Dad's side. I felt a driving need to talk to and reconnect with every cousin, uncle, and aunt there. I didn't go intending to be so pressed to do this. The compulsion just took on a life of its own.

Everything that I experienced was so familiar, yet so foreign. What is home? Like time itself our home is forever changing. We need to live our daily existence like Abraham did, always on the move. "By faith he made his home in the promised land like a stranger in a foreign country... For he was looking forward to the city, with foundations, whose architect and builder is God" (Heb. 11:9, 10).

Camp Searcy 2010

This past week about 20 or so from Refuge took part in Camp Searcy. This was an effort hosted by the College church in which the Downtown, Westside, Cloverdale, and Highway churches teamed up and united to serve our community.

On Sunday night, we got started by coming together for worship and a devotional. We also played a few games to break the ice and went over some of the rules and expectations for the week. We talked about the theme for the week, which was "Hands and Feet." The idea was that we were going to be the hands and feet of Jesus as we set out into Searcy to serve and glorify God.

On Monday and Tuesday we arrived at the College church around 8 a.m. to sing, gather supplies, go over a few announcements for the day, and then head off to our work sites. Some of the work we did included painting houses, and we were able to get five houses completed. However, not every house needed to be painted totally, as some just needed rails, eaves, or other miscellaneous parts of the house done. We did paint two full houses, as well as some extra touches like painting a porch and doing some landscaping.

Finally, on Wednesday, we finished all of our projects. As some crews finished their work, we joined together to complete any unfinished projects that needed to be done. That night we met together for an area-wide worship to praise God and thank him for using us during the week. It was a perfect way to end Camp Searcy.

If I had to describe everyone who participated in Camp Searcy, it would be with the way Paul instructs all of us to be in Romans 12:11 when he wrote, "**Never be lacking in zeal but keep your spiritual fervor in serving the Lord.**" I was so impressed by everyone's "zeal" and "spiritual fervor" as we served the Lord while we painted, scraped houses, raked leaves, and cut down bushes, all while working in humid, 90-degree temperatures. Not once did I hear anyone complain or grumble; rather, everyone worked hard, united and devoted to being the hands and feet of Jesus.

I boast in the Lord for our guys and girls from Refuge who were able to be part of Camp Searcy. I am thankful for their effort and Christlike attitudes, and for the sacrifice they made.
